BUTOVICE - Botenwald

Schneider Elisabeth, née Ertel (1721-1797)

- in 1771-97 she worked with her husband Jan Schneider on Labrador, where she died.

K U N Í N - Kunewald

Ballenhorst Rosina (1722-1791), née Hückel

- married Christ Daniel Pfohl (died 1742 in Herrnhag), second time married to David Wahnert (died 1765), third time married 1768 to Michael Ballenhorst. In 1768-78 she worked with him in Greenland.

Nitschmann Rosina, née Fischer (1714-1772)

- in 1737 she married David Nitschman "Syndikus". During her husband's travels she worked independently in Gota, Livonia in 1740-1743.

Schindler Matheus (1694-1771)

- in 1731-36 he worked on the Santa Cruz Islands.

S U C H D O L n.O. - Zauchtenthal

Kunz Mathäus (1722-1774)

- in 1748 he was in Pennsylvania, where on August 12, 1750 he married Anna Magdalena Ballenhorst for the first time, but she drowned in the Lecha River less than a month later (September 10). In 1754 he was in Greenland. In 1760 he sailed with his wife Anna (daughter of Michal Hans) to Tranquebar, India, where he arrived on August 22, 1761.

Liebisch Anna (1703-1770), née Schneider

- sister of David Schneider - wife of Martin Liebisch, she went to America in 1740.

Nitschmann David „Carpenter“ (1695-1772) , the first bishop

- from 1735 bishop, intended for the mission.

Seiffert Johann (1722-1802)

- in 1748 he went to Bethlehem.

Schenk Joh. Michael (1735-1771)

- since 1769 deacon, 1770 he went to Africa, where he died.

Š E N O V - Schönau

Nitschmann Johann „Senior“ (1711-1772) bishop

- his father Pavel Nitschmann was from Zauchtenthal and settled in Schönau. In 1748 he sailed with a 120-member expedition to Pennsylvania. He was there as a leader of local Brethren's congregations, but was not sent as a missionary.

HOLASOVICE - Kreisendorf

Lawatsch Andreas (1712-1771)

- in 1738 he married Anna Maria Demuth (1712-1760) from Mährisch Karlsdorf.

- He was a missionary in Suriname from 1764 to 1771, he died in Paramaribo. He had probably been to Pennsylvania before.

ROZUMICE - Rösnitz

Nitschmann Susanna (1721-1755), née Weicht

- she worked in the Indian congregation in Gnadenhütten on the river Mahoni, where they were attacked by another Indian tribe in 1755 and killed together with her husband Martin.
