

# Jubilees of Moravians from Moravia, Silesia and Bohemia in 2023, 2024, 2025

13 persons

## KUNÍN – Kunewald

**Schramm Mathäus (1724–1784) \* 300 years**

- Was a missionary in Tranquebar, where he died aged 61.

**Till Jakob (1741–1823) + 200 years**

- He emigrated in 1761, missionary at St. Thomas in 1768–1781.

## MANKOVICE – Mankendorf

**Stach Thomas (1724–1793) \*300 years**

- In the years 1740–1747 and 1749–51 he worked in Greenland, his wife was Elisabeth Lisberger.

**Stach Rosina – widow, née Halbgebauer (1691–1775), +250 years**

- She was the mother of Anna Stach, married to Böhnisch, her husband was Christian Stach from Mankendorf.
- In 1736 she sailed with her daughters Anna (13) and Rosina (23) to Greenland and stayed there until her death.

**Zacharias Anna, née Stach (1723–1808) \*300 years**

- In 1736 she went to Greenland with her mother and sister Rosina.
- In 1740 she married Bedřich Böhnisch.
- In 1764 as a widow she married again to Johannes Zacharias, with whom she worked in Greenland until 1784.
- 6 of her 9 children grew up, two of them were preachers and one was the wife of a missionary in Greenland.

## SUCHDOL n. O. – Zauchtel

**Jäschke Anna, née Zeisberger (1725–1762) \*300 years**

- She was the sister of Jiří Zeisberger the junior.
- She married Ondřej Jäschek.
- She worked with her husband in India in Tranquebar.
- On 23. 8. 1761 she went to Tranquebar, she died there already on 19. 3. 1762.

### **Kunz Mathäus (1722–1774) +250 years**

- In 1748 he was in Pennsylvania, where on 12. 8. 1750 he first married Anna Magdalena Ballenhorst, who, however, drowned in the Lecha River less than a month later (10. 9. 1750).
- In 1754 he was in Greenland; we have no record of when he returned, surely it would be found in Greenlandic history.
- In 1760 he sailed with his wife Anna (daughter of Michal Hans) to Tranquebar in India, where he arrived on 22. 8. 1761.

### **Seifert Anna, née Liebisch (1724–1744) \*300 years**

- She worked with her husband Anton Seifert from Niederlipka in Georgia, Pennsylvania and Ireland (according to Claus, she was not in Ireland).
- Antonín Seifert was married twice:  
I.oo 7. 11. 1742 with Anna Maria Liebisch (M), +15. 6. 1744 in Bethlehem,  
II.oo 25. 7. 1745 with Anna Maria Liebisch (German, born in Neukirch in Oberlausitz),  
+26. 10. 1784.

### **Schneider Juliana (1727–1773) +250 years**

- Missionary, unmarried sister, was on St. Thomas 1766–1773.

### **Schneider Paul II. (1724–1767) \*300 years**

- Missionary on St. Thomas 1762–1767.

## **ŽILINA – Söhle**

### **Waschke Juliane, née Jäschke (ca. 1723–1766) \*300 years**

- She married Georg Waschke on 10. 6. 1737, she was in Georgia 1736–1738.

## **LÍPA U HRADCE KRÁLOVÉ – Leipa near Königgrätz**

### **Morávek Jan (1731–1824) +200 years**

- He was active in Sarepta from 1769, but he was not among the Kalmyks.

## **ROZUMICE - Rösnitz**

### **Kremser Matheus (1723–1774) \*300 years, +250 years**

- In the years 1753–1774 he was on a mission on St. Thomas, where he died.
- His wife was Rosina Schulig (1730–1767) from Zauchtel.
