- **(07/2022) Temporary closure of the museum**

Please note: From Monday, July 18 until Sunday, July 24, 2022 the Museum of Moravian Brethren will be temporarily closed due to the holidays. The Museum will also be closed from August 10 to August 15, 2022.

- **(06/2022) Participation in the celebrations of 300 years of Herrnhut (June 17-19, 2022)**



This year commemorates 300 years since the founding of Herrnhut, an event not only important for the local Herrnhut congregation, but also for the Unity of the Brethren (Moravian Church) as a whole. In general, June 17, 1722 is considered the day when the building of Herrnhut in Saxony, Germany, began - a refuge for the exiles, the Moravian Brothers. Some members of the Moravian association, including the chairman Daniel Říčan and the leader of the project "Via Exulantis" Jáchym Pantálek, will also take part in the main part of the celebrations on June 17-19, 2022. During the ceremony, a representative of Moravian will have a public speech and the company's activities will be presented on an ongoing basis in the form of a stand with information materials.

- **(04/2022) Lectures on the Czech Reformation**

- **(04/2022) Another pilgrimage on the Via Exulantis**



On Monday, April 11, 2022, Josef Šimčík from Pňovice near Olomouc set out on foot on a pilgrimage from Suchdol n.O. to Herrnhut. He completed part of the route in the Czech territory, then continued in the direction of Nysa, Pilawa Górna, Swidnica, Jelenia Góra, Leuba, Herrnhut. In some places he visited the monuments left there by the Moravian Brethren. He covered about 400 km in nine days. - **(02/2022) Annual Membership Meeting 2022**



The annual membership meeting of the Moravian n.h.a took place on Monday, February 28, 2022 at 6 p.m. in the Museum of Moravian Brethren in Suchdol nad Odrou. The meeting took place in a videoconference mode, attended by a total of 12 members of the association. The session was chaired by the chairman Daniel Říčan. The resolution from the last annual meeting of 2021 was checked and reports on activities in the last year were presented. One of the largest events was the IX. international conference in September 2021, as well as Moravian's publishing activities (5 new publications), establishing of the Rose Glade Memorial and mapping of the Via exulantis way. Other smaller projects continued. Adjustments were also made in the Park of the Moravian Brethren and in the Museum of Moravian Brethren. A slightly lower number of visitors to the museum last year was caused by a coronavirus epidemic. As another part of the program, annual accounts and account audit reports were given. Moravian association has 63 members now, with 2 new members added last year. The meeting presented the planned activities for 2022, divided into seven long-term projects, including the financial budget for each item. Finally, a resolution was passed and approved.

- **(02/2022) Publication of another issue of Moravian bulletin**



In February 2022, the Moravian Newsletter No. 59 was published, which thematically returns to IX. International conference organized by Moravian association in September 2021 to mark the 300th anniversary of the birth of David Zeisberger, the Apostle of the Indians. It recapitulates the conference

program, presented papers and evaluates the overall course of this three-day meeting. The newsletter is published in both Czech and English version. - **(09/2021) Other publications from the Moravian association**



On the occasion of the IX. International Conference in September 2021, the Moravian association published several publications. Members of Moravian participated to a large extent in their authorship and elaboration. After a long period of preparations, the publication "Teltschik" was printed, which is the first attempt to present to the public a biography of Johann Teltschik (1696-1764), one of the most remarkable personalities of the Moravian Brethren. The authors of the publication are Sarah Groves, Lorraine Parsons (Great Britain) and Daniel Říčan (Czech Republic). It is published in Czech, English and German. Another title is published under the title "Rod Zeisbergerů", the author is Jáchym Pantálek. It aims to inform about the Zeisberger family, which combined its fate with the management of the Upper Court in Suchdol nad Odrou. The publication "The Diary of David Zeisberger (part 1/24)" is also related to this year's 300th anniversary of the birth of David Zeisberger, known as the "Apostle of the Indians". Zeisberger describes the events in the valley of the Muskingum-Tuscarawas river during his mission among the American Indians in the years 1772 - 1781. The Czech translation of this first part of the series was taken from the English version of Zeisberger's diaries. All the above publications (including many others) can be purchased at the Museum of Moravian Brethren in Suchdol nad Odrou.

- **(09/2021) The IX. International Moravian Conference**



Based on the decision of the Moravian n.h.a. committee, preparations were launched for the IX. Moravian International Conference, which is scheduled for September 24-26, 2021 in Suchdol nad Odrou. The main topic of the conference is "**300th Birth Anniversary of David Zeisberger, the apostle of the Indians**". Other 13 jubilant Moravian brothers will also be mentioned. A slightly limited conference design is expected due to coronavirus measures. The program and any restrictions will be further specified and an invitation with a detailed program will be published at the end of July 2021. - **(08/2021) Mapping expedition Via exulantis 2021**



On August 26, 2021, another mapping expedition set out on Via Exulantis. The team consisted of the Via Exulantis project's leader Jáchym Pantálek and two supporters Roman Lipový and Matěj Slíva. In relatively cold and rainy weather, after a short meeting at the Museum of the Moravian Brothers, they set out on a journey from Suchdol nad Odrou. The task of the participants of the expedition was to explore the terrain in more detail in a Via Exulantis' part, both on the Czech and Polish side, and possibly discover other possible variants of some sections of the road. They also focused on information about accommodation options at route.

- **(08/2021) Visit from Herrnhut and presentation on the journey along the Via Exulantis**





Benigna Carstens from Herrnhut in Germany, pastor and member of the UF directorate, visited Suchdol nad Odrou and took part in the regular Moravian meeting on August 16, 2021 in the Museum of the Moravian Brethren. Accompanied by the chairman of the association, Daniel Říčan, she also visited other memorable places in Suchdol. We learned a lot from her about the current events in Herrnhut. The next morning she set out on a five-day bike ride along the Via Exulantis. She created an interesting presentation with photographs about her journey through Krnov, Glucholazy, Prudnik, Nysa, Pilawa Górna, Swidnica and Jelenia Góra. - **(06/2021) Working activities in Herzogwald**



On Saturday, June 12, several members of the Moravian association organized a teamwork in the place of the vanished village of Herzogwald (in Czech Herčivald, Lesy) near the village of Dvorce in the district of Opava. From 1890 there had been a congregation of the Unity of Brethren, the only one in Moravia at the time. A bench for tourists was built on the roadside, where the information board and the memorial established by the Moravian assoc. are located. In the former cemetery of the Unity of Brethren, which until recently was completely desolate, fallen branches were cleared and the bushes that grew on the site of the former entrance gate were removed. A fallen cross was also erected at the end of an alley in the cemetery site. The cemetery was measured and a plan of the presumptive original layout of the individual graves was designed. The grave of the last preacher Wilhelm Schulz has already been identified (he died in 1945) and natives from the village living in Germany are helping to identify other places. The restoration of the writing on the monument dedicated to the village was carried out by the company Kamenictví Vítkov on the initiative of the Moravian association.

- **(03/2021) David Zeisberger - Apostle of the Indians - 300 years birth anniversary**  
(2. 3. 1721 Suchdol n.O. - 17. 11. 1808 Ohio)



In the building called "Horní dvůr" (Upper Court) in Suchdol nad Odrou, one of the the most important personalities of Moravia was born 300 years ago - David Zeisberger. He was one of those who created the history of the "New World", of America, in his time. A descendant of an old Unitas Fratrum family line, from which the whole family left their large estate under religious persecution and emigrated to Herrnhut and later to America. He lived to be 87 years old, of which he lived for fifty-three years hard life among his Native American brothers as a missionary of the Moravian Brethren. He founded 11 mission settlements, he was the author of Native American dictionaries and linguistic publications. Writers like Karl May and J. F. Cooper drew themes for their adventure books about the Delawars, the Mohicans and the Iroquois mainly from his diaries. He himself is a novel template in many publications. For this anniversary, the Moravian association will place a commemorative wreath and a poster on the birth house of David Zeisberger.

- **(03/2021) Annual Membership Meeting 2021**



The annual membership meeting of the Moravian n.h.a. took place on Monday, March 1, 2021 at 6 p.m. in the Museum of Moravian Brothers in Suchdol nad Odrou, this time in online mode. Fourteen members took part in the meeting. The session was chaired by the chairman of the association Daniel Říčan. The resolution of the last annual meeting of 2020 was audited and reports on activities of the association in the past year, as well as cash and audit reports were given. Three new members were accepted last year, the Moravian History Association has a total of 60 members now. Last year, progress was made in the "Via exulantis" and "Růžový palouček" projects, the preparation and printing of publications continued. Adjustments were also made to the Park of the Moravian Brethren and in the museum. The coronavirus epidemic was particularly adverse in the long-term closure of the Museum of Moravian Brethren and in substantial restrictions of the autumn commemorative events for the anniversary of J.A.Comenius. The meeting presented the planned activities for 2021, divided into seven long-term projects, including research, regional and promotional projects. In conclusion of the meeting a final resolution summarizing the tasks for this year, was passed and approved.

- **(12/2020) Publication of another issue of Moravian bulletin**

In December 2020, the Moravian Newsletter No. 55 was published, which describes commemorative events in Suchdol nad Odrou on the occasion of the 350th anniversary of the death of J. A. Comenius. The new issue of the periodical was prepared by the chairman of the Moravian assoc., Daniel Říčan. For this anniversary, the association in cooperation with a team of co-organizers prepared a project containing 6 events for the public. Due to measures to covid-19 epidemic, some actions could not be fully implemented. However, it is possible that they will still take place, because the commemorative events will continue freely until 2022 (430 years since the birth of J.A. Comenius). - **(12/2020) Preparations for the issue of a new publication on Johann Teltschik**



The Moravian assoc., in cooperation with the British Province of The Moravian Church, is preparing a new publication on Johann Teltschik. The book will contain reports on his missionary work and church planting in England and Ireland from 1739 to 1764, as well as historical contexts concerning his family and place of origin - Suchdol nad Odrou. The authors of the individual chapters are Lorraine Parsons (London, Great Britain), Sarah Groves (Gracehill, Great Britain) and Daniel Říčan (Suchdol n.O., Czech Republic). Language corrections and translations took place in November and December 2020. During the first quarter of 2021, the publication is expected to be printed in three languages: Czech, English and German.

- **(11/2020) Planned extension of the Herzogwald project**

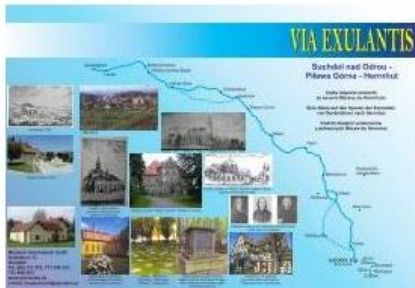


The vanished village of Herzogwald near the place of Dvorce (Hof) lies in today's district of Opava. From 1890 there was a congregation of the Unity of Brethren, the only one in Moravia at the time. The Moravian association started working here in 2014 and placed a memorial and information board near the place of former house of worship. There are also other memorable places there, such as the former cemetery of the Unity of Brethren. The Moravian assoc. is currently preparing a broader project with a view to several years,



which shall reveal the history of the village and the Brethren's congregation and to create a place of tourist interest too. The collaborator on the project is Karl-Heinz Körper from Berlin, whose family lived in Herzogswald until 1946.

The participants – children aged 12-15 years – will have an opportunity to learn something about the history of the Moravian Brethren and also about the activities of Moravian assoc. We suppose that their volunteer work will contribute to the upkeep of the Museum site and to improvement of some expositions. The programme will be conducted by Moravian members Daniel Říčan and Jáchym Pantálek.

- **(06/2019) The presence at the congress of compatriots**



Two Moravian members, living in Germany, Prof.Ulf Brossmann and Dr.Horst Schinzel, attended the congress of association of Sudeten compatriots (SDT) in Regensburg from June 6th to 9th 2019. The purpose was among others also to present the activities of Moravian assoc. and to introduce the history of the Unity of the Brethren and its heritage as a fact important not only for Czech but also for German history.

- **(05/2019) A way to Herrnhut alongside Via exulantis**

At the occasion of the conference "Barock und dennoch schlicht" a group of four Moravian members (Daniel Říčan, Jana Říčanová, Lukáš Martin and Jáchym Pantálek) visited Herrnhut in the period 24 May – 27 May 2019. Besides visiting sights and studying archives (Berthelsdorf, Museum of town H., cemetery, quarry, archive, visit to Dr. Meyer) four books for Moravian library were received and two publications were bought. By using a car for the way from Suchdol n.O. to Herrnhut, visits to some significant places of Via Exulantis were made possible (in Poland : Stolec, Pilava Górna – meeting at the mayor's office, Dzerżonów – visit to Mr.Kordasiewicz, Swidnica). In this way some personal contacts have been restored or even gained newly and further possibilities for development of Via Exulantis project have been considered.

- **(03/2019) Annual Membership Meeting 2019**



The Annual membership meeting of the Moravian n.h.a. took place on March 18th 2019 at 6 p.m. in the Museum of Moravian Brethren in Suchdol nad Odrou. Thirteen members and one guest participated in the meeting. The session was presided over by Daniel Říčan, the chairman of the association. At first checking of the previous 2018 Annual meeting resolution's fulfilment was carried out and then a report on Moravian activities in the last year was given, as well as annual accounts and account audit reports. It was reported that the annual museum attendance had risen up to 1400 visitors in 2018. Mr. Daniel Valchář was elected to become the third Moravian committee member, as the previous committee member Mr. Zdeněk Valchář had died in 2018. As a result of another vote, Mr. Jáchym Pantálek became the financial auditor, whose position had become loose before that. Daniel Říčan introduced the Activity plan of Moravian for 2019 being divided into six long-range projects and other projects of promotional type. In conclusion of the meeting a final resolution was passed and approved.
